

## **Sisel Laundry Detergent**

A funny story. well sort of. When I first used Sisel laundry detergent mid 2012 I realised a small amount was needed to wash the clothes, as Sisel product appeared to remove old built up detergent from washed clothes. so if I wasn't careful my washing machine would be too sudsy.

Well, yesterday little girl did a huge wee on bathroom floor. I put towelling bath mats down to soak up wee. I rinsed and soaked bath mats. Just now I decided to wash them. They still smelt so I decided to put in extra Sisel laundry detergent - probably 1/2 to 2/3 cap. You guessed it. I had soap suds coming through the front loader door and out through the section where soap detergent is poured. A little Sisel laundry detergent goes a long way.
